

- NEW Access to New Jersey Historic Newspapers Collection. Have your library card ready to search through a wide variety of old newspapers including the



## The Genuine Article

A reminder from the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA):

# **HOW TO SPOT FAKE NEWS**



#### CONSIDER THE SOURCE

Click away from the story to investigate the site, its mission and its contact info.



#### **CHECK THE AUTHOR**

Do a quick search on the author. Are they credible? Are they real?



#### CHECK THE DATE

Reposting old news stories doesn't mean they're relevant to current events.



#### **CHECK YOUR BIASES**

Consider if your own beliefs could affect your judgement.



#### READ BEYOND

Headlines can be outrageous in an effort to get clicks. What's the whole story?



#### SUPPORTING SOURCES?

Click on those links. Determine if the info given actually supports the story.



#### IS IT A JOKE?

If it is too outlandish, it might be satire. Research the site and author to be sure.



#### ASK THE EXPERTS

Ask a librarian, or consult a fact-checking site.



While we may find it difficult to convince other people that some stories are "fake news," we can each do our part to slow down and check what we share or accept as fact. This graphic above is a quick guide. Contact us at the library if you would like a little help finding credible sources or fact checking.

Quality, accurate information is important to any decision-making. Protecting your right to these resources is an important mission of libraries all around the world. Including your hometown library.
