NEWS & UPDATES

- <u>MEW MASK UPDATE: AS OF THIS WRITING</u> the Borough Administration and Library Trustees have not yet lifted the mask mandate for inside the library. Until further notice, masks inside the library are required for all visitors.

We can also help you with learning more about local opportunities for the J&J (single dose) and Pfizer (two doses, for ages 12+).



The Genuine Article

AMAZING LIBRARY FACTS

There may be no greater repository of analog information than the library, a glorious assembly of printed pages that can take us on adventures, educate us, and fill our days and nights with details of worlds beyond our own—all free of charge. Today, there are roughly 116,867 public and academic libraries dotting the country. Enjoy these facts about some interesting libraries around the world.

- BENJAMIN FRANKLIN STARTED A LENDING LIBRARY IN 1731. One of the oldest public libraries in the country opened in 1790 in Franklin, Massachusetts, where residents circulated books donated by Benjamin Franklin. The Founding Father once started his own lending library in 1731 in Philadelphia called the Library Company, but it required a subscription fee of 40 shillings.
- PHILANTHROPIST ANDREW CARNEGIE WAS A ONE-MAN LIBRARY-FUNDING MACHINE. The
 wealthy industrialist donated \$55 million—or \$1.6 billion in today's dollars—between 1886 and 1919 to
 open an astonishing 2509 libraries worldwide, including 1679 in the United States. The Freehold Public
 Library is one of forty-two Carnegie libraries in New Jersey, and the only one with the benefactor's
 name etched into the building (over the front door).
- VERMONT IS HOME TO A LIBRARY THAT STRETCHES ACROSS THE U.S BORDER INTO CANADA. The Haskell Free Library and Opera House sits directly on the border between the United States and Canada. You can walk in from Stanstead, Quebec, and exit into Derby Line, Vermont. You don't need a passport to cross the (literal) line running through the building, but you do have to return to your country of origin or risk fines.
- BATS CAN BE A LIBRARY'S BEST FRIEND. The Joanina Library at the University of Coimbra in
 Portugal has a number of bats in residency, but no one is calling for an exterminator as the bats prey on
 insects that could damage book pages. Staff drape tables with coverings overnight and clean up the
 guano in the morning. (Side note: a few years ago a bat made its way into our library, but obligingly flew
 out the front door when staff arrived to open the building for the day!)
- IT'S NEVER TOO LATE TO RETURN A BOOK. If you stumble across a forgotten library book that's been hiding on your shelf for weeks, months, or even years, don't be afraid to return it. In 2015, Eleanor Reed, a former student at Wakefield High School Library in Wakefield, Virginia, sent back a copy of *The Underside of the Leaf*. It was borrowed in 1981 and accidentally mixed in with the student's family collection. In 2016, the granddaughter of a man who had taken out *The Microscope and Its Revelations* from Hereford Cathedral School in the UK returned the title 120 years after it had been "borrowed." Even if the library has "written off" the loan, expecting it won't be returned, it is always good to see a long-lost asset make its way back "home."

SOME LIBRARIES WENT TO EXTRAORDINARY LENGTHS TO MAKE SURE THEIR TITLES
 REMAINED ON THE SHELF. At Marsh's Library in Dublin, Ireland, visitors hoping to peruse rare books
 in the 1800s were locked in cages until they were finished reading the material.
