Dear Library Patron

What do The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-Time Indian by Sherman Alexie, The Bluest Eye by Toni Morrison, and Of Mice and Men by John Steinbeck have in common?

They're on the 2021 list of banned/challenged books.

Now, *banned* is a pretty strong word. In truth, most books that appear on "banned books lists" are titles that somebody objected to in a specific setting (such as on a school reading list). Reasons may include content and "appropriateness" for a given audience, descriptions of violence or sex, objectors making assumptions about the material based on criticism by public figures, or even cover art. Some titles, including many older works, are considered offensive because of disfavored stereotypes or obsolete racial terminology.

In the public library setting, the idea behind "intellectual freedom" (which is library-speak for the liberty of users to acquire content or information they want or need without censorship, judgement or restriction), means a variety of viewpoints, genres, and themes. While no library goes out of its way to be offensive or upsetting, as librarian Mary Jo Godwin says, "A truly great library contains something in it to offend everyone."


Library Information
