Freehold Borough has achieved Sustainable Jersey Bronze Certification in 2019 and continues working to maintain the certification and implementing other initiatives. WINTER REMINDERS - SNOW ACCUMULATION AROUND FIRE HYDRANTS: New Jersey law requires the owner of a property which abuts a fire hydrant to remove any snow which may accumulate within 24 hours of the snow coverage. Failure to remove the snow may result in a bill for snow removal service in an amount not to exceed \$75.00. Please note that the owner or tenant of a property bordering a sidewalk is responsible for the removal of all ice and snow within twelve (12) hours after it has accumulated.

COMMUNITY GARDEN: If you are looking for a friendly place to grow fresh healthy food or continue to add to a healthy lifestyle, come join us at the Freehold Community Garden.

The community garden strives to develop a group of citizens who work together to create a successful garden and improve the community beyond its gates. The garden provides an opportunity for participants to grow their own fresh vegetables and herbs, as well as produce, that will be donated to local organizations that assist families in need. Also provided are educational opportunities related to gardening, sustainability, and wellness.

The garden is located on Lloyd St., off Center St. It has been growing for 15 years in many ways. The soil has been amended with compost and only OMRI approved herbicides and pesticides have been allowed. There are flowers, herbs, perennial, and shared gardens. The curbside flower gardens are filled with Hostas, bulbs and native plants beautify the neighborhood. There is a pollinator garden that attracts birds and butterflies. We also have a food bank and teaching bed.

PET LICENSE RENEWALS: Pet licenses must be renewed by February 28th in order to avoid a late fee. Proof of rabies vaccinations valid through February 28th is required in order to obtain a pet license. The fee for neutered dogs is \$11.20 per year, and \$14.20 per year if the dog is not neutered. The fee for a cat license is \$10.00 a year.
