CURBSIDE BRUSH/LEAF COLLECTION will take place in the Borough during the months of April, July and October in 2023, Limbs should be no longer than 4 ft, in length, Leaves may also be placed at the curb for collection in a separate pile from the brush. Please be sure the brush and leaves do not interfere with any storm drains in your area. Please note the removal of brush will not begin until November 1st. Removal will begin November 1st and each street will be picked up ONLY once. As a reminder, the DPW site at 161 Center St. is open for brush drop off on the first Saturday of every month from 7am - noon.



WATER HYDRANT FLUSHING - WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 11, 2023: Fall flushing of fire hydrants will be conducted on Wednesday, October 11, 2023 starting at 8:00 a.m. and continuing until all flushing has been completed. Residents may notice lower water pressure and a slight discoloration of the water as the flushing is performed in your area. The discoloration is caused by naturally occurring minerals and sediments and is not harmful. Your water will clear up if you allow the water to run for a few extra minutes. Flushing is done twice a year in order to remove any sediment that may accumulate in the water distribution system. This operation maintains the overall excellent water quality in our distribution system and ensures that each fire hydrant operates properly and is available for fire protection.

FREE FIREWOOD HARVESTING PROGRAM: The Lake Topanemus Commission is currently hosting a free Firewood Harvesting Program at the lake for homeowners to obtain free firewood while supporting maintenance of the park and promoting healthy outdoor activities. NOVEMBER GENERAL ELECTION: The Official Election Ballot Drop Box at Borough Hall is open! You can securely drop your ballot at 30 Mechanic Street until 8:00 PM on Election Day, November 7, 2023. Early Voting Locations are also available starting on October 28th - November 5th throughout the county. The closest to Freehold Borough are the Colts Neck Public Library and the Monmouth County Library in Manalapan. LEAD AND COPPER: The Borough of Freehold is seeking willing residents to take part of our semi-annual lead and copper monitoring pool. Beginning January 1, 2024 residents potable water must be supplied by the Borough of Freehold. Between the dates of January 1st - June 31st and July 1st - December 31st a sample bottle will be delivered to the resident's address for a sample to be collected from their tap, the resident will then place the bottle in the same location where it was originally left and will be picked up the following day. Get alerted about emergencies, important community news, and local events by signing up for our Everbridge Notification Program.

This notification system enables your municipality to provide you with critical information quickly in a variety of situations, such as severe weather, unexpected road closures, missing persons, and evacuation of buildings or neighborhoods. You will receive the critical messages wherever you specify, such as your home, cell, or business phone, email, text messages, hearing impaired receiving devices, and more. You pick where, you pick how you would

like to receive the critical messages. This notification system offers you to be informed with the happenings in community via email only.
