Dear Library Patron

When does summer end?

That depends on who you ask, why you need the answer, and even where you are.

There's *astronomical summer*, which is based on Earth's position in relation to the sun. This reckoning puts the end of the season at the September Equinox (September 23 this year) for those of us in the northern hemisphere. For folks south of the equator, their next astronomical summer ends on March 20, 2024.

Meteorological summer is a more conditions- and observations-based assignment of the season considering actual weather and climate. In the northern hemisphere, this usually means June, July and August. In the southern hemisphere, meteorological summer spans December, January and February. This understanding of summer is useful in studying weather patterns over time or for large-scale planning.

Various traditions, cultures and religions describe summer differently; time-tracking technologies and conventions have changed, and exposures to other ideas have influenced societies over time. For example, in the Hindu calendar (India), "summer" is one of six seasons, and may be defined as roughly the two months of May and June (*Grishma Ritu*). Then comes *monsoon season*! Some native North American tribes counted five seasons, others four, based on the rhythms of life in their environment.

While we may take our calendar for granted, even the nations of Europe didn't settle on a single scheme until the 1920s (which makes studying history fun and causes you question whether all those dates you memorized were really the *right dates*!) Look into the differences between <u>Julian</u> and <u>Gregorian</u> calendars if you want to make yourself dizzy.

In Florida, where I spent most of my school years, "summer" came to a screeching halt in the middle of August as school terms began (though the unrelenting hot weather persisted). Students of Freehold Borough Elementary School District enjoy summer break until September 7 this year.

Then there's the "unofficial" summer season, the period of time between the start of Memorial Day weekend and ending on Labor Day (coming on September 4). This pins "summer" to the economic

engine of the tourism industry, especially along coastal areas, and is thus important to us in Monmouth County. As visitors, tourists and vacationers withdraw to their normal lives, Shore-area residents enjoy a treasured "local summer" which tapers off usually in early October as we tumble into autumn-like weather.

As for us at the library, the close of the season brings us a little closer to our anticipated return to East Main Street. We look forward to celebrating all our future summers in our beautifully restored home.
