For now, I want to plant a few seeds of anticipation by highlighting library programs that we'll resume or phase-in once we're back "home." Feel free to send me any program or collaboration ideas for in-library as well as outreach programs.

I hope you will help us "hit the ground running" when we open shop in our *old and improved* building, if not before.

Children's Services:

- *Toddler Time*: music and movement for lap-babies through preschool and their caregivers.
- *Little Kid Storytime*: story and related activity or craft for kindergarten through second grade.
- Kids Club: enrichment and activities for grades three through five.
- Supervised student/youth-led service projects.
- Community partner/business-presented programs.
- Custom-designed programs for visiting groups (schools, youth organizations and clubs).

Parents/Families

- "Playdate" hosting for existing parent/friend groups, *au pairs*, or care-givers and their children.
- Homeschool enrichment programs.
- Game nights, pajama storytimes, and other library-led family opportunities.
- Programs for families with atypical or special needs.
- Family nutrition and health/wellness programs.

Teen Services:

- *Teen Library Committee* (TLC): volunteer, leadership, service and fun for grades six through high school.
- *Freehold TLC 4-H Club*: membership (free) organization overlapping with TLC but with expanded opportunities.
- Career, vocation and college-bound informational and support events.
- Volunteer/service project opportunities.
- Special events, entertainment and programs guided by teen interests and needs.

New Adults:

- Events focused on interests and needs of college-aged and "twenty-somethings" in the area.
- Opportunities for leisure, recreation and peer-initiated community-building pursuits.
- Programs connecting with community engagement and leadership opportunities.

Adult Services:

- *Book Group* (will resume meeting on the first Wednesday of each month as soon as our building reopens!)
- Interest-focused groups such as "Come Write in!" writers group, crafting/hobby clubs, etc.
- Friends of the Library group to build community partnerships and organize events.
- Periodic special programs/presentations for information, assistance or entertainment.

Seniors:

- Programs focused on the needs and wishes of our *more experienced* community members.
- Variety of recreation, community-building and entertainment programs.
- Opportunities to strengthen intergenerational partnerships and relationships.
