WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 45:4-67 permits the Governing Body of each Municipality to fix the rate of interest to be charged for non-payment of taxes or assessments subject to any abatement or discount for late payment of taxes as provided by Law; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A.54:4-67 has been amended to permit the fixing of said rate of 8% per annum on the first \$1,500.00 of the delinquency, and 18% per annum on any amount in excess of \$1,500.00, and authorizes a penalty of 6% to be collected against a delinquency in excess of \$10,000.00 on properties that fail to pay the delinquency prior to the end of the calendar year; and

WHEREAS, Statutes further provide for the Borough to designate an employee who would be authorized to cancel property tax refunds/credits or delinquencies, and utility credits or balances, which are less than \$10.00; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Freehold deem it desirable to encourage prompt payment of all Water & Sewer rents in order to permit sound fiscal planning; and

WHEREAS, Water & Sewer bills are due and payable upon receipt.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Freehold, County of Monmouth, and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. The Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to charge 8% per annum on the first \$1,500.00 of taxes becoming delinquent after due date, and 18% per annum on any amount of taxes in excess of \$1,500.00 becoming delinquent after due date, and if a delinquency in excess of \$10,000.00 remains in arrears beyond December 31st, a penalty of 6% of the amount of the delinquency shall be charged.

- 2. Effective January 1, 2024, no interest shall be charged if payment on any tax installment is made within the ten (10) calendar days following the date upon which the installment became due.
- 3. Any payments not made in accordance with Paragraph Two of this Resolution shall be charged interest from the tax due date.

With respect to the Tax Sale Certificates, when the taxes, interest and costs shall exceed the sum of \$5,000.00, an additional sum equal to four percent (4%) of such amount to be paid shall be added to the amount to be paid, and when that sum exceeds \$10,000.00, an additional sum equal to six percent (6%) of such amount to be paid shall be added to the amount to be paid. These charges shall also apply to all existing Certificates being held by the Borough.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING A CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD

WHEREAS, THE State of New Jersey Department of Community Affairs has requested that all government entities update their cash management plans to insure compliance with NJSA40A:5-14; and,

WHEREAS, THE Freehold Borough Chief Financial Officer recommends that the attached Cash Management Plan for Fiscal Year 2024 be adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Freehold, in the County of Monmouth, and the State of New Jersey that the Fiscal Year 2024 Cash Management Plan is hereby adopted as indicated in the annexed document.

2024 CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD COUNTY OF MONMOUTH

I. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE.

This Cash Management plan (the plan) is prepared pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14 in order to set forth the basis for the deposits ("Deposits") and investment ("Permitted investments") of certain public funds of the Borough of Freehold, pending the use of such funds for the intended purposes. The Plan is intended to assure that all public funds identified herein are deposited in interest bearing Deposits or otherwise invested in Permitted Investments hereinafter referred to. The intent of the Plan is to provide that the decisions made with regard to the Deposits and the Permitted Investments will be done to insure the safety, the liquidity (regarding its availability for the intended purposes), and the maximum investment return within such limits. The Plan is intended to insure that any Deposit or Permitted Investment matures within the time period that approximates the prospective need for the funds deposited or invested so that there is not a risk to the market value of such Deposits or Permitted Investments.

II. <u>IDENTIFICATION OF FUNDS AND ACCOUNTS TO BE COVERED BY THE PLAN</u> <u>AND DESIGNATED SIGNATORES ON ALL ACCOUNTS.</u>

A. The Plan is intended to cover the deposit and/or investment of the following funds and accounts of the Borough of Freehold:

CURRENT FUND WATER/SEWER OPERATING FUND TRUST FUNDS (*) GENERAL CAPITAL FUND WATER/SEWER CAPITAL FUND PARKING OPERATING FUND PARKING CAPITAL FUND PAYROLL ACCOUNTS INVESTMENT ACCOUNT

(*) – As determined by the Chief Financial Officer or automatic or applied for to the Division of Local Government Services, State of New Jersey, and approved on the Certified List of Dedication by Rider.

B. The Mayor and Chief Financial Officer are hereby authorized as check signers on all accounts of the Borough of Freehold in designated depositories.

III. DESIGNATION OF OFFICIALS OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD AUTHORIZED TO MAKE DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS UNDER THE PLAN.

The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough of Freehold is hereby authorized and directed to deposit and/or invest the funds referred to in the Plan. Prior to making any such Deposits or any Permitted Investments, such officials of the Borough of Freehold are directed to supply to all depositories or any other parties with whom the Deposits or Permitted Investments are made a written copy of this Plan which shall be acknowledged in writing by such parties and a copy of such acknowledgment kept on file with such officials.

IV. DESIGNATION OF DEPOSITORIES.

The following banks and financial institutions are hereby designated as official depositories for the Deposit of all public funds referred to in the Plan, including any certificates of Deposit which are not otherwise invested in Permitted Investments as provided for in this Plan:

Amboy Bank Bank of America, N.A. Chase Bank Citizens Bank First Commerce Bank Freehold Bank Ocean First Bank PNC Bank, N.A. Provident Bank Santander Bank TD Bank, N.A. Valley National Bank Wells Fargo Bank, N.A.

V. DESIGNATION OF BROKERAGE FIRMS AND DEALERS WITH WHOM THE DESIGNATED OFFICIALS MAY DEAL.

The following brokerage firms and/or dealers and other institutions are hereby designated as firms with whom the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough of Freehold referred to in this Plan may deal for purposes of buying and selling securities identified in this Plan as Permitted Investments or otherwise providing for Deposits:

State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund New Jersey Asset and Rebate Management Program (NJARM)

VI. AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS.

A. Except as otherwise specifically provided for herein, the Designated Official is hereby authorized to invest the public funds covered by this Plan, to the extent not otherwise held in Deposits, in the following Permitted Investments:

(1) Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United States of America;

(2) Government money market mutual funds;

(3) Any obligation that a federal agency or a federal instrumentality has issued in accordance with an act of Congress, which security has a maturity date not greater than 397 days from the date of purchase, provided that such obligation bears a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or other external factor;

(4) Bonds or other obligations of the local unit or bonds or other obligations of school districts of which the Local Unit is a part or within which the school district is located; and

(5) Bonds or other obligations, having a maturity date not more than 397 days from the date of purchase, approved by the Division of Investment of the Department of the Treasury for investment by Local units;

(6) Local Government Investment pools;

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(7) Deposits with the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund established pursuant to section 1 of P.L. 1977, c.281 (c.52:18A-904); and

(8) Agreements for the repurchase of fully collateralized securities if:

- (a) the underlying securities are permitted investments pursuant to to paragraphs (1) and (3) of this subsection a:
- (b) the custody of collateral is transferred to a third party;
- (c) the maturity of the agreement is not more than 30 days;
- (d) the underlying securities are purchased through a public depository as defined in section 1 of P.L. 1970, c.236 (c.17:9-41); and
- (e) a master repurchase agreement providing for the custody and security of collateral is executed.

For purposes of the above language, the terms "government money market mutual fund" and "local government investment pool" shall have the following definitions:

Government Money Market Mutual Fund. An investment company or investment trust:

(a) which is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission under the "Investment Company Act of 1940," 15 u.s.c. sec. 80a-1 et seq., and

operated in accordance with 17 C.F.R. sec. 270.2a-7.

(b) the portfolio of which is limited to U.S. Government securities that meet the definition of any eligible security pursuant to 17 C.F.R. sec. 270.2a-7 and repurchase agreements that are collateralized by such U.S. Government Securities; and

(c) which has:

(i) attained the highest ranking or the highest letter and numerical rating of a nationally recognized statistical rating organization; or

(ii) retained an investment advisor registered or exempt from registration with the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the "Investment Advisors Act of 1940," 15 U.S.C. sec.80b-1 et seq., with experience investing in US Government securities for at least the most recent past 60 months and with assets under management in excess of \$500 million.

Local Government Investment Pool. An Investment Pool:

(a) which is managed in accordance with 17 C.F.R.sec.270.2a-7;

(b) which is rated in the highest category by a nationally recognized statistical rating organization.

(c) which is limited to U.S. Government securities that meet the definition of an eligible

security pursuant to 17 C.F.R. sec. 270.2a-7 and repurchase agreements that are collateralized by such U.S. Government securities;

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(d) which is in compliance with rules adopted pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c410 (c.52:14B-l et seq.) by the Local Finance Board of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs, which rules shall provide for disclosure and reporting requirements, and other provisions deemed necessary by the board to provide for the safety, liquidity and yield of the investments;

(e) which does not permit investment in instruments that are subject to high price volatility with changing market conditions; cannot reasonably be expected, at the time of interest rate adjustment, to have a market value that approximates their par value; or utilize an index that does not support a stable net asset value; and

(f) which purchases and redeems investments directly from the issuer, government money market mutual fund, or the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund, or through the use of a national or State bank located within this state, or through a broker-dealer which, at the time of purchase or redemption, has been registered continuously for a period of at least two years pursuant to section 9 of P.L. 1967 c.9 (C49:3-56) and has least \$25 million in capital stock (or equivalent capitalization if not a corporation), surplus reserves for contingencies and undivided profits, or through a securities dealer who makes primary markets in U.S. Government securities and reports daily to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, its position in and borrowing on such U.S. Government securities.

VII. SAFEKEEPING CUSTODY PAYMENT AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RECEIPT OF PLAN.

To the extent that any Deposit or Permitted Investment involves a document or security which is not physically held by the Borough of Freehold, then such investment or security shall be covered by a custodial agreement with an independent third party, which shall be a bank or financial institution in the State of New Jersey. Such institution shall provide for the designation of such investments in the name of the Borough of Freehold to assure that there is no unauthorized use of the funds or the Permitted Investments or Deposits. Purchase of any Permitted Investments or securities shall be executed by a "delivery versus payment" method to insure that such Permitted Investments are either received by the Borough of Freehold or by a third party custodian prior to or upon the release of the Borough of Freehold's funds.

To assure that all parties with whom the Borough of Freehold deals either by way of Deposits or Permitted Investments are aware of the authority and the limits set forth in this Plan, all such parties shall be supplied with a copy of this Plan in writing and all such parties shall acknowledge the receipt of that Plan in writing, a copy of which shall be on file with the Designated Official(s).

VIII. PETTY CASH FUND

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Reimbursements for expenditures through the Petty Cash Fund shall be made with the limits approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services. The Petty Cash Fund shall be maintained in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:5-21. Petty Cash funds shall be maintained in the following amounts:

Chief Financial Officer – \$500.00 Chief of Police - \$400.00

IX. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.

Periodically, the Designated Official referred to in Section III hereof may supply to the Governing Body of the Borough of Freehold a written report of any deposits or permitted investments made pursuant to this Plan, which shall include, at a minimum, the following information:

A. The name of any institution holding funds of the Borough of Freehold as a deposit or Permitted Investment.

B. The amount of securities or Deposits purchased or sold during the immediately preceding month.

C. The class or type of securities purchased or Deposits made.

D. The book value of such Deposits or Permitted Investments.

E. The earned income on such Deposits or Permitted Investments. To the extent that such amounts are actually earned at maturity, this report shall provide an accrual of such earnings during the immediately preceding month.

F. The fees incurred to undertake such Deposits or Permitted Investments.

G. The market value of all Deposits or Permitted Investments as of the end of the immediately preceding month.

H. All other information which may be deemed reasonable from time to time by the Governing Body of the Borough of Freehold.

X. TERM OF PLAN.

This plan shall be in effect from January 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024. Attached to this Plan is a resolution of the Governing Body of the Borough of Freehold approving this Plan for such period of time. This Plan may be amended from time to time. To the extent that any amendment is adopted by the Council, the Designated Official is directed to supply copies of the amendments to all of the parties who otherwise have received the copy of the originally approved Plan, which amendment shall be acknowledged in writing in the same manner as the original Plan was so acknowledged.

WHEREAS, Freehold Borough agrees to enter into the Indemnity and Trust Agreement with the GSMJIF.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Freehold that it hereby authorizes continued membership in the Garden State Municipal Joint Insurance Fund for a period not to exceed three (3) years, beginning January 1, 2024 to December 31, 2026 for Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability; Liability other than motor vehicle; Property Damage other than motor vehicle, Property, Motor Vehicle insurance.

 Monmouth ______, State of New Jersey, by and Between the Garden State Municipal Joint Insurance Fund, hereinafter referred to as "FUND", and the Governing Body of the _______

 Borough of Freehold _______ (name of municipality), a duly constituted local unit of government hereinafter referred to as "MUNICIPALITY";

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, several local governmental units have collectively formed or are in the process of forming a Joint Insurance Fund as such an entity is authorized and described in NJSA 40A:10-36 et seq. and the administrative regulations promulgated pursuant thereto and:

WHEREAS, the MUNICIPALITY has agreed to become a member of the FUND in accordance with and to the extent provided for in the bylaws of the FUND and in consideration of such obligations and benefits to be shared by the membership of the FUND;

NOW THEREFORE, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. The MUNICIPALITY accepts the FUND'S bylaws as approved and adopted and agrees to be bound by and to comply with each and every provision of the said bylaws and the pertinent statutes and Administrative Regulations pertaining to same and as set forth in the Risk Management Plan.
- 2. The MUNICIPALITY agrees to participate in the FUND with respect to the types of insurance listed in Borough of Freehold's Resolution.
- 3. The MUNICIPALITY agrees to become a member of the FUND for an additional period not to exceed three (3) years, beginning January 1, 2024 to December 31st, 2026 the commencement of which shall coincide with the effective date of the FUND'S operation and coverage, or the effective date of membership, whichever occurs later.
- 4. The MUNICIPALITY certifies that it has never defaulted on any claims if self insured and has not been canceled for non-payment of insurance premiums for a period of at least two years prior to the date thereof.



- 5. In consideration of membership in the FUND the MUNICIPALITY agrees that it shall jointly and severally assume and discharge the liability of each and every
- 6. member of the FUND, all of whom as a condition of membership in the FUND shall execute a verbatim counterpart of this Agreement and by execution hereof the full faith and credit of the MUNICIPALITY is pledged to the punctual payment of any sums which shall become due to the FUND in accordance with the bylaws thereof, this Agreement, the Fund's Risk Management Plan or any applicable Statute.
- 7. If the FUND in the enforcement of any part of this Agreement shall incur necessary expense or become obligated to pay attorney's fees and/or Court costs the MUNICIPALITY agrees to reimburse the FUND for all such reasonable expenses, fees and costs on demand.
- 8. The MUNICIPALITY and the FUND agree that the FUND shall hold all monies paid by the MUNICIPALITY to the FUND as fiduciaries for the benefit of FUND claimants all in accordance with NJAC 11:15 2.1 et seq.
- 9. The FUND shall establish separate Trust Accounts for each of the following categories of risk and liability:
 - Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability
 - Liability, other than motor vehicle
 - Property Damage, other than motor vehicle
 - Property
 - Motor Vehicle

The FUND shall maintain Trust Accounts aforementioned in accordance with NJSA 40A: 10-36, NJAC 11:15.2 et seq., NJSA 40A: 5-1 and such other statutes as may be applicable. More specifically, each of the aforementioned separate Trust Accounts shall be utilized solely for the payment of claims, allocated claim expense and excess insurance or reinsurance premiums for each such risk or liability or as "surplus" as such term is defined by NJAC 11:15-2.2.

10. Each MUNICIPALITY who shall become a member of the FUND shall be obligated to execute this Agreement.
