

HALF MILE OF HORSES ART WALK

"The Pride of Monmouth County"

2026 Artist Information Packet





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The Neighborhood Preservation Program & Freehold Borough Historic Preservation Commission with Downtown Freehold are calling all artists to participate in the **2026 Half Mile of Horses Art Walk**. The project involves painted horse sculptures decorating Main Street, honoring the equine heritage of Freehold Borough, (formerly home to the oldest half-mile horse racing track in the county)! We welcome your participation in a public art project combining creativity and history.

Thousands of people are expected to view and engage with the installation while patronizing the restaurants and shops in Freehold's vibrant downtown. The project is an exciting opportunity for artists and sponsors alike to gain recognition and participate in local arts culture. Both sponsors and artists will be promoted in print and social media, at events and on public display with their sculpture.

Artists who would like to participate must submit an executed template illustrating their proposed design along with the supporting application materials. *We value partnerships and accept applications from artists with sponsors.* Support materials and horse templates are attached herein, and are also available at freeholdboroughnj.gov and in Borough Hall at 30 Mechanic Street, Freehold, NJ 07728.

The submitted templates should be considered as a detailed study for the overall sculpture. Submitted templates should be a clear representation of what the sculpture will look like if chosen. *Any artist with Patron committed support should provide the information at the time of submission. Patron Sponsorship is \$1,000.00 for the fabrication of a horse.* All submissions will be judged by the NPP Committee.

15 designs will be chosen for this year's exhibit. Effort is important – detailed and carefully executed designs are more likely to be chosen!

Completed designs (maximum 3 submissions per artist) need to be submitted via email to freeholdboronpp@freeholdboro.org or Borough Hall at 30 Mechanic Street, Attn: Dominica Napolitano by Friday, April 17, 2026 for selection committee review. Selected 2026 submissions will be announced the week of May 4, 2026 and artists will also be contacted directly.

Selected artists will be issued a hard-coated horse sculpture to paint on their design. The undecorated horse sculptures will be available for pick up at StoneDog Studios, located at 17 Bannard Street #12 Freehold, NJ 07728 during the week of May 18 – May 22, 2026. **Artist will have five (5) weeks to bring their design to fruition.** Completed sculptures must be returned to StoneDog Studios during the week of June 15 -June 19, 2026.

The horses will be on display on Main Street from July-October 2026. An accompanying QR code will be attached to each sculpture base. The public will be encouraged to vote for their favorite horses. A ribbon ceremony identifying the winning horses (Win, Place and Show) will take place in October.

Timeline:

- March 30, 2026 – Artist Packet is released.
- April 17, 2026 – Submit designs and supporting materials.
- May 4 – May 8, 2026 (week of) – Winning designs are selected and artists notified.
- May 18 - May 22, 2026 – Selected artists pick up their sculptures for decoration at StoneDog Studios (17 Bannard Street #12, Freehold, NJ 07728).
- June 15 – June 19, 2026 – Artists return completed sculptures back to StoneDog Studios (17 Bannard Street #12, Freehold, NJ 07728).
- July 7, 2026 – *Event opens – tentative.*
- October 2026 – Award / Ribbon ceremony recognizing the winning horses and closing the event.

Submission Checklist:

Artists submit the following to freeholdboronpp@freeholdboro.org or in person or by mail to Borough Hall, 30 Mechanic Street, Attn: Dominica Napolitano by Friday, April 17, 2026 for selection committee review.

___ Signed artist agreement (Attached herein; this also serves as the application form).

___ Executed template (Attached herein; up to three templates per artist is allowed) illustrating proposed design.

Selection Process:

1. Submissions will not be reviewed without the signed artists agreement.
2. The NPP committee will review all submission packages.
3. Submissions must be deemed appropriate for a family-friendly event (see design criteria below).
4. Artists will be notified if their design is selected.
5. If selected, Artists will be asked to sign a contract, including a copyright agreement, agreeing to deliver their finished sculpture to StoneDog Studios by the week of June 15 - June 19, 2026.

Acknowledgement of Artists:

Artists chosen to participate in the event will be recognized in the following ways:

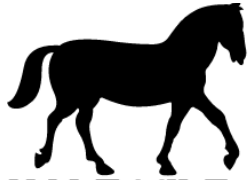
1. The artist, title and sponsor of each horse will be displayed on a plaque mounted to the pedestal of each sculpture.
2. The artist, title and sponsor of each horse will be listed in print, online and in social media throughout the season.
3. The artist, title and sponsor of each horse will be featured on the Monmouth County GIS mapping system of the Half Mile of Horses Art Walk. See last year's here: <https://storymaps.arcgis.com/stories/085d70662c1640348d25cb14bcee7035>

Design Criteria for Sculptures:

1. Designs must be appropriate for public display. Designs that are religious, political or sexual in nature, use corporate logos or advertising will not be accepted. A review panel will review all designs. The review panel has the sole discretion to accept or reject any design.
2. Half Mile of Horses is a public art exhibit. The sculptures will be located in public, outdoor locations where the public may touch the designs. Public safety is a significant concern. Designs should be created with durability and safety in mind.
3. These sculptures will remain outside, *at minimum*, for the duration of the exhibit from July to October. All artists should understand the sculptures will remain outside indefinitely and material used must be able to withstand all weather elements in New Jersey.
4. All sides of the sculpture must be decorated (all angles will be visible).
5. Artists may alter the basic form but cannot compromise its structural integrity. The contact points by which the horse is attached to its base cannot be altered or obstructed. For example, wings may be added to the horse, but it cannot be removed from its base to suggest it is flying.

Technical & Materials Guide:

1. Attaching items or additions (see specifications below): Objects may be attached. Any object attached must be done so in a way that it cannot be easily removed or broken. Any attached objects also must be weather resistant.
2. A universal **primer** will be applied to each horse prior to Artist pick-up. There is no need to apply additional primers.
3. **Oil-based enamels** (aerosol, brushed or applied with professional spray equipment) all adhere very well to the surface of the form. Oil-based enamels provide a hard, weather resistant surface that does not flake. Polyurethane and urethane-based paints as well as high quality acrylic paints also work well.
4. **Acrylics:** Professional grade paint by brands like Golden, Windsor & Newton, Daler Rowney, Pebeo, Lascaux, Liquitex and others. *Read labels carefully! Avoid products that have low colorfast ratings as they will fade: these will disappear in the sun!*
5. **Adhesives:** typical 5-minute epoxy is very effective. Common polyester and polystyrene body fillers such as Bondo or Evercoat are excellent for use both as an adhesive and as a material for sculpting shapes and textures on the horses. For ultimate bond, use adhesives and fillers on the form *before* applying the paint. For sculpture, Magic Sculpt or DAS Clay is recommended, but be sure to cover those areas with a sealant prior to painting. Follow all manufacturer guidelines for application and drying times.
6. StoneDog Studios will provide a hard, weather resistant clear coat finish to the sculptures to ensure weather durability. Artists must fill out attached materials identification sheet and return to StoneDog Studios when completed artwork is dropped off to ensure compatibility with their clear coat and your artwork.

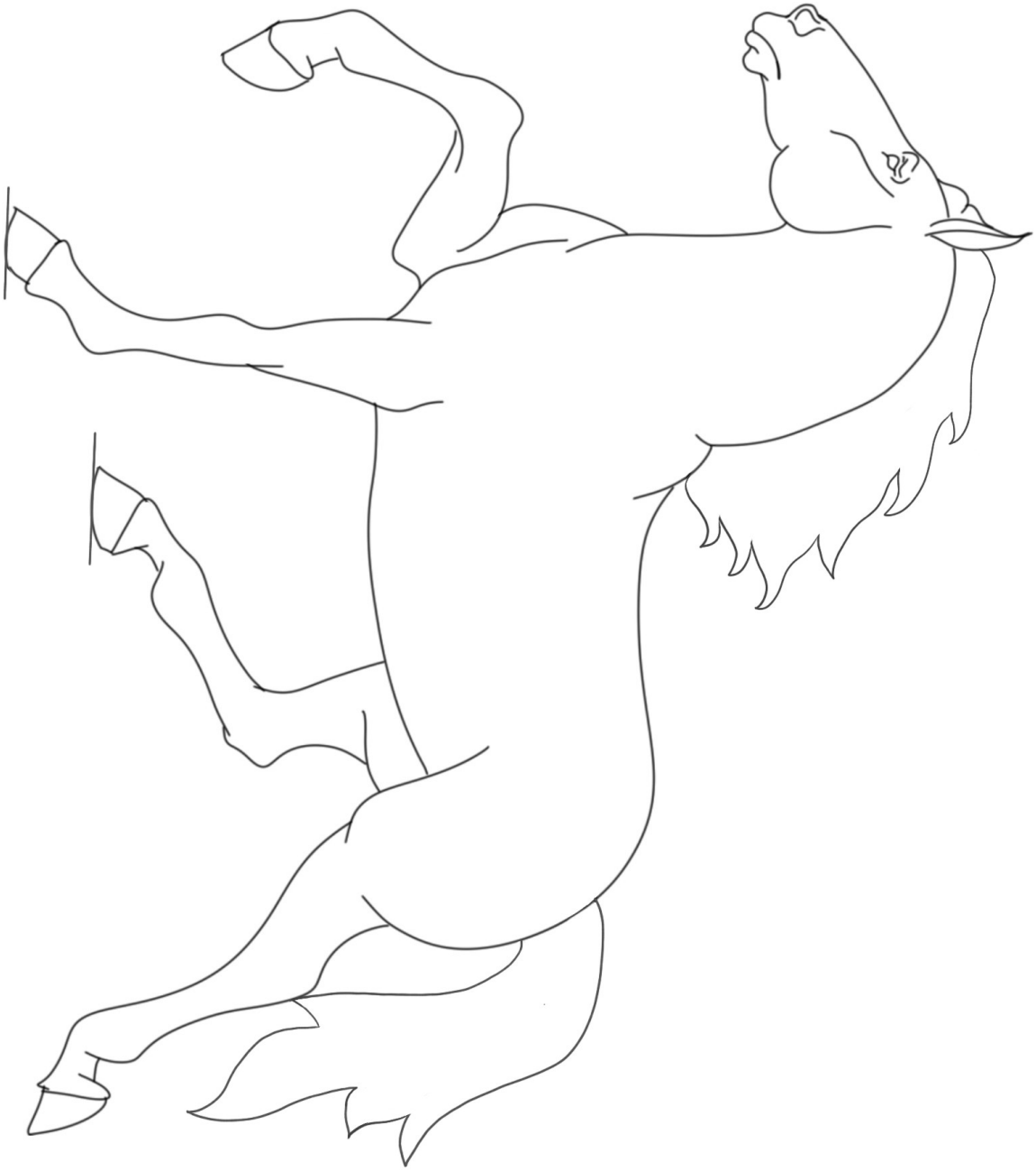
