FIRST: set-up a password with the Freehold Public Library's online catalog system

1. go to www.freeholdpubliclibrary.org, Click on the "Books & More" tab, then click on the first item: "Click here to search our card catalog."
2. click "sign in"
3. where it says "login name/barcode" enter your Freehold Public Library card number (barcode).
4. leave the "password" box empty
5. click "sign in"
6. click "my account"
7. on the left side, click "change login/password"
8. leave "login name/barcode" box empty
9. enter a password in the "password" and "confirm password" boxes
10. click "OK"
11. the system will take you back to the sign-in page.
12. Re-enter your library card number/barcode, and new password.
Click "sign in"

From here you can check the status of your account (see what you have out, fines, etc.), check your borrowing history (going back to 2006), and renew any material that is not overdue or that someone else isn't waiting for.

NOTE: If you forget your password, contact the library to reset it.



**NEXT: set-up your
ebook/digital audiobook borrowing account**

1. go to <https://elibrarynj.overdrive.com/>
2. click "sign in"
3. from the drop-down menu (on the left), click on "Freehold Public Library"
4. where it says "card number" enter your Freehold Public Library card number (barcode).
5. where it says "PIN" enter your Freehold Public Library password (If you have not already set up a Freehold Public Library password, you will have to do that first)
6. click "sign in"
7. you'll be taken to the eLibraryNJ/OverDrive page where you can search, borrow, put items on hold, etc.
8. There are help features on that page to assist you to use OverDrive.
9. If there are any problems with your library card/account that prohibit you from logging in or borrowing, you'll be prompted to contact the Freehold Public Library. You can do that by calling 732-462-5135 or emailing help@freeholdpubliclibrary.org.

Genre Spotlight:

Historical Fiction



Historical fiction is a story set in the past, usually during a significant time period. In historical fiction, the time period is an important part of the setting and often of the story itself.

It generally includes a mixture of fictional characters and well-known historical figures. Authors of historical fiction usually pay close attention to the details of their stories (settings, clothing, dialogue, etc.) to ensure that they fit the time periods in which the narratives take place.

In some historical fiction, famous events appear from points of view not recorded in history, showing historical figures dealing with actual events while depicting them in a way that is not recorded in history. Other times, the historical event or time period complements a story's narrative, forming a framework and background for the characters's lives. Historical fiction can be for the most part true, but the names of people and places have been in some way altered.

You can find Romance, Mystery, Suspense, and, of course, Westerns as sub-genres of Historical Fiction.
