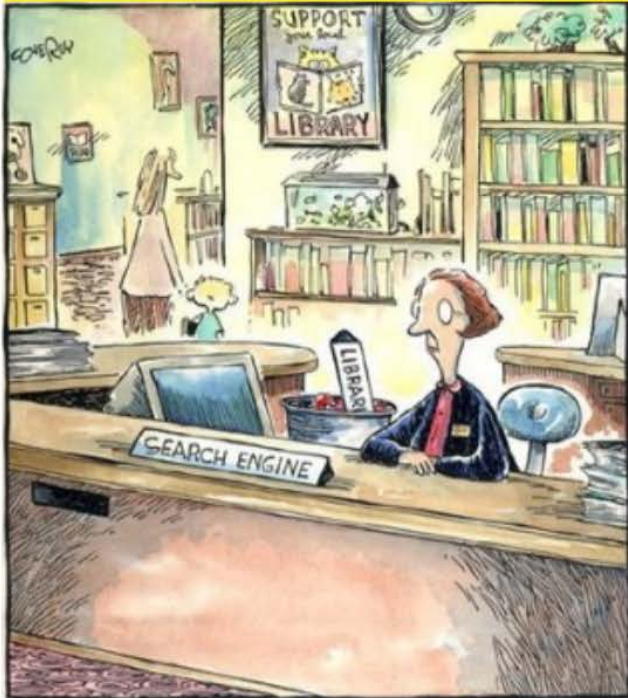

Genre Spotlight:
Wait for it...wait for it....



Books of the suspense genre keep readers on the edge of their seats with increasing tension and menace. A protagonist has only a short time period to neutralize a threat to himself or the world—but does s/he have the personal resources or skills to do so? The anticipation keeps readers hooked. A sense of menace permeates, with this unease building to a dramatic climax. Action drives the stories, and dangers beset the characters at every turn.

These thrillers are usually legal, medical, science or political stories and are among the most widely-read of all the genres.

Often Suspense books also fall into other genres such as: mysteries, romance, historical, paranormal and adventure.

Popular authors of this genre include David Baldacci, James Patterson, John Grisham, Iris Johanson, Justin Cronin, and Gillian Flynn.

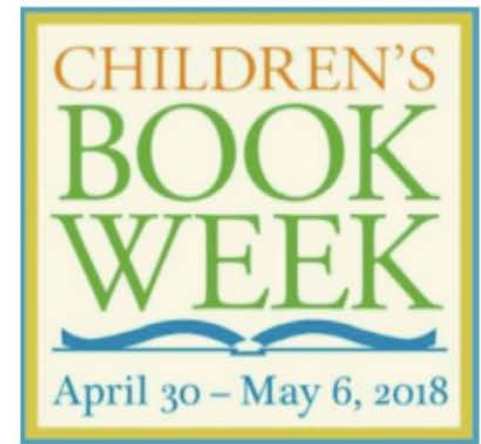

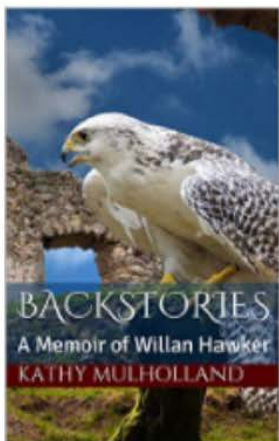
Book Group

On June 6 at 7 pm, the group will host our very own Kathy Mulholland, author of **Backstories: A Memoir of Willan Hawker**.

The book, a National Novel Writing Month (NaNoWriMo) project, is a fantasy novel inspired by a live-action roleplay (LARP) located here in New Jersey.

Copies of June's book are available at the library for \$10 each. Half of the proceeds will be donated to the library.



Willan is an old soul without a goal, traveling aimlessly while earning bread and coin as a hawker. Unlike the typically heroic denizens of the realm, Willan avoids other folks and, especially, shuns adventure. Nevertheless, adventure, drama and sometimes friendship intrude upon a solitary life where the only reliable companions are a cat and a bird, and an occasional cup of ale.
