

### Library Trivia

• The worlds's oldest library is St. Catherine's monastery in Sinai, Egypt. Built in the middle of the 6th Century, it houses the second largest collection of religious material in the world (after the Vatican). However, it is accessible onlyl to monks and invited scholars. The Library of Paris, in combination with the National Library of France, is the oldest continually-operating public library service. It dates back to 1368, when it was housed at the Louvre.

• The largest library in the world is the United States' Library of Congress. The collections include more than 36 million books and other print material, 3.5 million recordings, 13.7 million photographs, 5.5 million maps, 6.7 million pieces of sheet music, and 69 million manuscripts. This library is also responsible for the material classification system often found in universities, research institutions and larger libraries. It is apply called the Library of Congress Classification. Many school and public libraries, including the Freehold Public Library, use the famous Dewey Decimal System.

• The most stolen library book is the Bible, followed by the Guiness World Records book. It's ironic that a book that includes a prohibition of stealing is most stolen, and the World Record book holds 2nd place in "most stolen" category, right?

• The smallest library in the world is difficult to judge, because "Little Free Libraries" have grown popular in recent years. Among the smallest are bright yellow dome-like structures scattered around New York City. Each can accommodate one standing person to browse the tiny collection, or escape the noise and bustle of the city for a few moments lost in a book.
