Just what does *patron* mean?

According to Dictionary.com, the noun *patron* is a *person who is a customer, client, or paying guest, especially a regular one, of a store, hotel, or the like.* By this definition, all library users-adults borrowing books and movies, children coming to Toddler Time, travelers seeking local information, students using printers, seniors learning how to surf the Internet, and commuters reading eBooks-are patrons.

Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary, 10th Ed., further defines a patron as one who uses wealth or influence to help an individual, an institution, or a cause. In this manner, everyone who recognizes the value of a library, and acts accordingly, is a patron.

You were a patron when you voted for the New Jersey Library Construction Bond Act. Or when you pay taxes which provide for library services in your community and beyond. Or when you serve with the Library Trustees or Friends group.

Neither of these definitions, "customer" or "supporter," tell the whole story, however.

In my opinion, the highest, greatest definition of a *library patron* is not just someone who uses or supports the library. No, a library Patron (with a capital P) is *someone who is in relationship with the library*. We have many such Patrons:

• The mother who brought her newborn baby to the library to share her joy.

• The young couple who, because of a mutual love of libraries, had their engagement photos taken on our front steps.

The teen volunteer page who is now a professional librarian.
The techno-phobic senior citizen, now working to help his

employer's customers manage their cell phone apps. • The young man who came in to thank us: he passed his

driver's license test!

• The college student who proudly shared his multimedia project with us (he got an A).

• The middle-schooler who kept getting in trouble, but found a safe, accepting place at the library. Then went on to serve his country in the United States Army.

• And many more true stories from lives in Freehold. and beyond.

We are honored and proud that you, our Patrons, write the library into your own life stories.


