

"A truly great library contains something in it to offend everyone." (Jo Godwin)

I'm a little behind-the-times to mention this, but the last week of September was Banned Books Week.

"Banned Books Week is an annual event celebrating the freedom to read. Typically held during the last week of September, it spotlights current and historical attempts to censor books in libraries and schools. It brings together the entire book community—librarians, booksellers, publishers, journalists, teachers, and readers of all types—in shared support of the freedom to seek and to express ideas, even those some consider unorthodox or unpopular." (American Library Association's website.)

Your library is an advocate for your right to read (or access) whatever information, entertainment or content you want.

Does this mean we will put on our shelves everything you may want to read? No library has the room or resources to do that for every individual, and as stewards of our shared community resources, it's just not practical to imagine we can do that. However, if we don't have books you want, we will try to get you those titles via interlibrary loan. We are usually successful in finding the book you want, as long as a participating library is able to loan it to us.

Does it mean we go out of our way to bring provocative or offensive material to you? Of course not. We don't try to jab a hornet's nest and stir-up trouble just to make a point or prove how "anti-banned books" we are. We are, as I mentioned, stewards of our community resources, so trying to pick a fight with our constituents isn't a good idea.

Do we seek-out material that challenges people's attitudes? It is part of our job to facilitate access to a wide range of ideas, styles, preferences and resources to encourage free-thinking, increased opportunities, personal growth and enjoyment of literature in all its forms. So, yes, in a way, we do try to offer some material that may appeal to people on the margins of popular thought and craft. We recognize that no community—certainly not our wonderful Freehold—is comprised of people who all believe in, or enjoy, exactly the same things. But at the same time, we deliberately build our collection to include many items that are similar to what our patrons already enjoy: favorite authors and genres, classic literature, and popular topics in fiction and nonfiction.

But what Banned Books Week speaks to, and what we, as a public library, honor, is that no one has the right to get between the reader and the books they want to read (and this concept is expanded to include access to digital media, including unfettered access to information).

So, while we may not have everything you want at our fingertips to give to you, we will staunchly defend your right to access that material, and assist you in that pursuit as far as we are able. We promise.

What we can't promise, however, is that you might not occasionally be surprised, confused, or even offended, by material you encounter at your (or any) public library. But, who knows, you may discover something interesting, beautiful, or even life-changing.
