Dear Library Patron

Studies* show that reading fiction, especially literary fiction, increases empathy in readers. When reading about other people, especially journeying along with people who are different from ourselves, we have an opportunity to get to know them, even though they aren't "real." This prepares us to be more open-minded and empathetic towards people we meet or work with. It's as if reading fiction trains us to walk a mile in the characters' shoes, and we're better people for making this a habit.

A good New Year's Resolution may be to read a novel set in a very different world than that which you occupy. A story perhaps set in another country, time, or culture. Challenge yourself to empathize with the characters as they go through their stories. This may help you see another person in a new light.

Reading one novel is not likely to change the whole world, and maybe not even much of your own world. But any increase in empathy—in understanding the plight and circumstances of another—would be a nice holiday gift for not only yourself, but for the people in your life.
