Surf the Changes

Much is changing at the library, in the community of Freehold, and beyond. Some of these changes we meet with optimism or excitement, others with trepidation. Even "good" changes can be stressful, but change we fear can put us in a place of hopelessness. As I have confronted changes in my own life, I try to imagine myself a surfer. I've found these observations (or imaginings) helpful; perhaps you will as well.

- Surfers sometimes swim. They're right in the middle of an uncontrollable situation which ranges between calm and chaotic. They have moments of rest where they're just hanging off the board, watching and listening. They aren't always riding high.
- Surfers don't catch every wave. Sometimes, in spite of a surfer's skill, the wave passes under (or over) them and continues on toward the shore. Surfers know that sometimes they just have to *let it go*.
- There's always another wave. Even if they miss a great wave, or take a tumble and lose it, surfers are hopeful for another chance. They know that what's important is to stay in the water.
- **Surfers are persistent**. If they aren't persistent, they aren't surfers! Repeated attempts, with various failures and successes, are opportunities to learn, to improve. It's just a part of the experience.
- **Surfers must continuously rebalance**. Achieving equilibrium on a surfboard is a fleeting accomplishment. Surfers must constantly adjust their stance as the conditions change around them.
- Surfers watch the weather. They don't just stumble out of their house and it's a good surf day. When they judge conditions are right, they'll load up their gear and head to the shore. If they are unable to hit the beach for whatever reason, they keep their eyes on the forecast for another opportunity.
- Surfers have a special perspective. They realize the ocean has been making waves for a very, very long time. Long before they were born. And the surf will continue to roll long after they're gone. They also know the ocean environment isn't deliberately hostile or benevolent. It just is and it's nothing personal if they get tossed.
- Surfers know that adjusting to change is just part of the sport. Tides turn. Winds shift. Storms come and go.
 Even the sand and seabed is constantly reformed with new shoals and channels. Marine animals may make an
 appearance. Some of these changes may be anticipated. Others may catch even the most experienced by
 surprise.
- Surfers know they can control only so much. The action and effects of tides, currents, winds, topography, and all the other natural forces at play are completely beyond a surfer's influence. Surfers don't begrudge the ocean its complexities. What surfers can control are their own decisions and attitudes about the sport, and their own responses to the myriad uncertainties and risks.
- **Surfers choose to surf**. In spite of everything, or maybe *because of everything*, surfers still engage the waves. Because the ride is worth it.
