WHEREAS at the discretion of the municipal court judge, and based upon the defendant's financial situation, the Court may appoint the municipal public defender to represent the individual's interests

WHEREAS <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 2B:24-4 requires a municipal public defender to be an attorney-atlaw of this State in good standing and shall serve for a term of one year from the date of his appointment and may continue to serve in office pending re-appointment or appointment of a successor; and

WHEREAS Ray Raya, Esq. had previously submitted a proposal pursuant to the Request for Qualifications advertised by the Borough and is capable of and willing to perform such services for an amount not to exceed \$13,000 and is an attorney-at-law of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that, contingent upon Council approval and inclusion of said item in the Temporary Budget and the adopted 2023 Budget, that sufficient funds for said contract will be made available in the following account(s): A/C #3-01-6-656-151;

WHEREAS this contract is awarded without competitive bidding as a "Professional Service" in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(1)(a)(i) of the Local Public Contracts Law because the service to be provided are legal services requiring considerable training and specialized study.

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD FIXING THE RATE OF INTEREST TO BE CHARGED ON DELINQUENT TAXES, ASSESSMENTS AND WATER/SEWER ACCOUNTS FOR 2023

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 45:4-67 permits the Governing Body of each Municipality to fix the rate of interest to be charged for non-payment of taxes or assessments subject to any abatement or discount for late payment of taxes as provided by Law; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A.54:4-67 has been amended to permit the fixing of said rate of 8% per annum on the first \$1,500.00 of the delinquency, and 18% per annum on any amount in excess of \$1,500.00, and authorizes a penalty of 6% to be collected against a delinquency in excess of \$10,000.00 on properties that fail to pay the delinquency prior to the end of the calendar year; and

WHEREAS, Statutes further provide for the Borough to designate an employee who would be authorized to cancel property tax refunds/credits or delinquencies, and utility credits or balances, which are less than \$10.00; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Freehold deem it desirable to encourage prompt payment of all Water & Sewer rents in order to permit sound fiscal planning; and

WHEREAS, Water & Sewer bills are due and payable upon receipt.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Freehold, County of Monmouth, and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. The Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to charge 8% per annum on the first \$1,500.00 of taxes becoming delinquent after due date, and 18% per annum on any amount of taxes in excess of \$1,500.00 becoming delinquent after due date, and if a delinquency in excess of \$10,000.00 remains in arrears beyond December 31st, a penalty of 6% of the amount of the delinquency shall be charged.

- 2. Effective January 1, 2023, no interest shall be charged if payment on any tax installment is made within the ten (10) calendar days following the date upon which the installment became due.
- 3. Any payments not made in accordance with Paragraph Two of this Resolution shall be charged interest from the tax due date.
- 4. With respect to the Tax Sale Certificates, when the taxes, interest and costs shall exceed the sum of \$5,000.00, an additional sum equal to four percent (4%) of such amount to be paid shall be added to the amount to be paid, and when that sum exceeds \$10,000.00, an additional sum equal to six percent (6%) of such amount to be paid shall be added to the amount to be paid. These charges shall also apply to all existing Certificates being held by the Borough.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Borough Tax Collector is hereby authorized to cancel any property tax refunds/credits or delinquencies and utility credits or balances, of less than \$10.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the rate of interest to be charged for the non-payment in full of Water & Sewer charges not received within thirty (30) days of issuance of the quarterly bill is eight percent (8%) on any amounts under \$1,500.00 and eighteen percent (18%) interest on all amounts over \$1,500.00. This interest shall be calculated quarterly on the current and outstanding user charges due each billing period, and shall accrue from the date of the bills rendered.

2023 CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD COUNTY OF MONMOUTH

I. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE.

This Cash Management plan (the plan) is prepared pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14 in order to set forth the basis for the deposits ("Deposits") and investment ("Permitted investments") of certain public funds of the Borough of Freehold, pending the use of such funds for the intended purposes. The Plan is intended to assure that all public funds identified herein are deposited in interest bearing Deposits or otherwise invested in Permitted Investments hereinafter referred to. The intent of the Plan is to provide that the decisions made with regard to the Deposits and the Permitted Investments will be done to insure the safety, the liquidity (regarding its availability for the intended purposes), and the maximum investment return within such limits. The Plan is intended to insure that any Deposit or Permitted Investment matures within the time period that approximates the prospective need for the funds deposited or invested so that there is not a risk to the market value of such Deposits or Permitted Investments.

II. <u>IDENTIFICATION OF FUNDS AND ACCOUNTS TO BE COVERED BY THE PLAN AND DESIGNATED SIGNATORES ON ALL ACCOUNTS.</u>

A. The Plan is intended to cover the deposit and/or investment of the following funds and accounts of the Borough of Freehold:

TRUST FUNDS (*)
GENERAL CAPITAL FUND
WATER/SEWER CAPITAL FUND
PARKING OPERATING FUND

- (*) As determined by the Chief Financial Officer or automatic or applied for to the Division of Local Government Services, State of New Jersey, and approved on the Certified List of Dedication by Rider.
- B. The Mayor and Chief Financial Officer are hereby authorized as check signers on all accounts of the Borough of Freehold in designated depositories.

III. <u>DESIGNATION OF OFFICIALS OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD AUTHORIZED</u> <u>TO MAKE DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS UNDER THE PLAN.</u>

The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough of Freehold is hereby authorized and directed to deposit and/or invest the funds referred to in the Plan. Prior to making any such Deposits or any Permitted Investments, such officials of the Borough of Freehold are directed to supply to all depositories or any other parties with whom the Deposits or Permitted Investments are made a written copy of this Plan which shall be acknowledged in writing by such parties and a copy of such acknowledgment kept on file with such officials.

IV. <u>DESIGNATION OF DEPOSITORIES.</u>

VI. AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS.

- A. Except as otherwise specifically provided for herein, the Designated Official is hereby authorized to invest the public funds covered by this Plan, to the extent not otherwise held in Deposits, in the following Permitted Investments:
 - (1) Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United States of America;
 - (2) Government money market mutual funds;
 - (3) Any obligation that a federal agency or a federal instrumentality has issued in accordance with an act of Congress, which security has a maturity date not greater than 397 days from the date of purchase, provided that such obligation bears a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or other external factor;
 - (4) Bonds or other obligations of the local unit or bonds or other obligations of school districts of which the Local Unit is a part or within which the school district is located; and
 - (5) Bonds or other obligations, having a maturity date not more than 397 days from the date of purchase, approved by the Division of Investment of the Department of the Treasury for investment by Local units;
 - (6) Local Government Investment pools;
 - (7) Deposits with the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund established pursuant to

- (8) Agreements for the repurchase of fully collateralized securities if:
 - (a) the underlying securities are permitted investments pursuant to to paragraphs (1) and (3) of this subsection a:
 - (b) the custody of collateral is transferred to a third party;
 - (c) the maturity of the agreement is not more than 30 days;
 - (d) the underlying securities are purchased through a public depository as defined in section 1 of P.L. 1970, c.236 (c.17:9-41); and
 - (e) a master repurchase agreement providing for the custody and security of collateral is executed.

For purposes of the above language, the terms "government money market mutual fund" and "local government investment pool" shall have the following definitions:

Government Money Market Mutual Fund. An investment company or investment trust:

- (a) which is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission under the "Investment Company Act of 1940," 15 u.s.c. sec. 80a-1 et seq., and operated in accordance with 17 C.F.R. sec. 270.2a-7.
- (b) the portfolio of which is limited to U.S. Government securities that meet the definition of any eligible security pursuant to 17 C.F.R. sec. 270.2a-7 and repurchase agreements that are collateralized by such U.S. Government Securities; and (c) which has:
 - (i) attained the highest ranking or the highest letter and numerical rating of a nationally recognized statistical rating organization; or
 - (ii) retained an investment advisor registered or exempt from registration with the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the "Investment Advisors Act of 1940," 15 U.S.C. sec.80b-1 et seq., with experience investing in US Government securities for at least the most recent past 60 months and with assets under management in excess of \$500 million.

Local Government Investment Pool. An Investment Pool:

- (a) which is managed in accordance with 17 C.F.R.sec.270.2a-7;
- (b) which is rated in the highest category by a nationally recognized statistical rating organization.
- (c) which is limited to U.S. Government securities that meet the definition of an eligible security pursuant to 17 C.F.R. sec. 270.2a-7 and repurchase agreements that are collateralized by such U.S. Government securities;

- (d) which is in compliance with rules adopted pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c410 (c.52:14B-l et seq.) by the Local Finance Board of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs, which rules shall provide for disclosure and reporting requirements, and other provisions deemed necessary by the board to provide for the safety, liquidity and yield of the investments;
- (e) which does not permit investment in instruments that are subject to high price volatility with changing market conditions; cannot reasonably be expected, at the time of interest rate adjustment, to have a market value that approximates their par value; or utilize an index that does not support a stable net asset value; and
- (f) which purchases and redeems investments directly from the issuer, government money market mutual fund, or the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund, or through the use of a national or State bank located within this state, or through a broker-dealer which, at the time of purchase or redemption, has been registered continuously for a period of at least two years pursuant to section 9 of P.L. 1967 c.9 (C49:3-56) and has least \$25 million in capital stock (or equivalent capitalization if not a corporation), surplus reserves for contingencies and undivided profits, or through a securities dealer who makes primary markets in U.S. Government securities and reports daily to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, its position in and borrowing on such U.S. Government securities.

VII. SAFEKEEPING CUSTODY PAYMENT AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RECEIPT OF PLAN.

To the extent that any Deposit or Permitted Investment involves a document or security which is not physically held by the Borough of Freehold, then such investment or security shall be covered by a custodial agreement with an independent third party, which shall be a bank or financial institution in the State of New Jersey. Such institution shall provide for the designation of such investments in the name of the Borough of Freehold to assure that there is no unauthorized use of the funds or the Permitted Investments or Deposits. Purchase of any Permitted Investments or securities shall be executed by a "delivery versus payment" method to insure that such Permitted Investments are either received by the Borough of Freehold or by a third party custodian prior to or upon the release of the Borough of Freehold's funds.

To assure that all parties with whom the Borough of Freehold deals either by way of Deposits or Permitted Investments are aware of the authority and the limits set forth in this Plan, all such parties shall be supplied with a copy of this Plan in writing and all such parties shall acknowledge the receipt of that Plan in writing, a copy of which shall be on file with the Designated Official(s).

VIII. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.

Periodically, but at a minimum on a quarterly basis during which this plan is in effect, the Designated Official referred to in Section III hereof shall supply to the governing body of the Borough of Freehold a written report of any deposits or permitted investments made pursuant to this Plan, which shall include, at a minimum, the following information:

- A. The name of any institution holding funds of the Borough of Freehold as a deposit or Permitted Investment.
 - B. The amount of securities or Deposits purchased or sold during the immediately preceding month.
 - C. The class or type of securities purchased or Deposits made.
 - D. The book value of such Deposits or Permitted Investments.
 - E. The earned income on such Deposits or Permitted Investments. To the extent that such amounts are actually earned at maturity, this report shall provide an accrual of such earnings during the immediately preceding month.
 - F. The fees incurred to undertake such Deposits or Permitted Investments.
 - G. The market value of all Deposits or Permitted Investments as of the end of the immediately preceding month.
 - H. All other information which may be deemed reasonable from time to time by the Governing Body of the Borough of Freehold.

IX. TERM OF PLAN.

This plan shall be in effect from January 1st, 2023 to December 31st, 2023. Attached to this Plan is a resolution of the Governing Body of the Borough of Freehold approving this Plan for such period of time. This Plan may be amended from time to time. To the extent that any amendment is adopted by the Council, the Designated Official is directed to supply copies of the amendments to all of the parties who otherwise have received the copy of the originally approved Plan, which amendment shall be acknowledged in writing in the same manner as the original Plan was so acknowledged.
