ORDINANCE #2023/9

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT TITLE 18 "ZONING" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Freehold, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1

Title 18 "Zoning" of the Code of the Borough of Freehold shall be amended as follows; additions to the current ordinance are noted in underline.

18.73.010 Minimum required off-street parking spaces

E. A parking requirement for a use may be satisfied through the provision of dedicated parking at an off-site location. The off-site location shall be located within one-quarter mile (one thousand three hundred twenty (1,320)) a 700-foot radius of the property whose parking requirement is being satisfied. The parking arrangement shall be formalized through a legal instrument such as a deed, lease, or easement deemed acceptable by the borough zoning officer attorney. Any off-street parking supplied in this manner shall run with the land (not be invalidated by change in ownership), and any subsequent change in use that requires more parking shall require subsequent action to satisfy any additional parking requirements.

18.73.020 Parking deficiency

Any developer who may require a parking space variance from the requirements of Section 18.73.010 shall, as a condition of that variance, make a contribution to the municipal parking capital improvement fund in the amount of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) for each parking space the project is deficient, for a maximum contribution of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00).

Section 2

If any part of this Ordinance shall be deemed invalid such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remaining part of this Ordinance.

Section 3

Any Ordinance or portions thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed and superseded.

Section 4

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication in accordance with Law.

BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD COUNTY OF MONMOUTH

BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2023-12

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE THROCKMORTON STREET ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT, APPROPRIATING \$1,440,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,110,860 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY

- BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:
- Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough of Freehold, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$1,440,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, including \$329,140 grant funds expected to be received from the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT). No down payment is required or appropriated herein, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11c of the Local Bond Law.
- Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes not provided for by the application of a down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$1,110,860, pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which the obligations are to be issued consist of the Throckmorton Street Roadway Improvement Project, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with contracts, plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Borough Clerk, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$1,110,860, as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$1,440,000, which is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor. The excess of the appropriation of \$1,440,000 over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the \$329,140 grant funds expected to be received from the NJDOT for said project.
- Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough (the "Chief Financial Officer"),

provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

- Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is twenty (20) years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$1,110,860 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$240,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.
- (e) To the extent that moneys of the Borough are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the Borough reasonably expects such costs to be paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto. This ordinance shall constitute a declaration of official intent for the purposes and within the meaning of Section 1.150-2(e) of the United States Treasury Regulations.
- Section 6. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the

form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

- Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the Borough for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements within the appropriation herein authorized or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.
- Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and, unless paid from other sources, the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.
- Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY ESTABLISHING SUMMER PROGRAM FEES

WHEREAS, the Borough of Freehold (the "Borough") is a public body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has previously adopted and periodically updated rules and regulations for the governance of the parks and facilities of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council seeks to update certain sections of the Borough Code regarding the governance of the parks and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1

Title 12 "Streets, Sidewalks, and Public Places" of the Code of the Borough of Freehold shall be amended as follows; additions to the current ordinance are noted in underline.

12.28.065 Summer Camp Fees

The Freehold Borough Summer Recreation Program fees are \$25 for the first child and \$5 extra for each additional child for Borough residents. The Recreation Program fees for non-Borough residents are \$50 for the first child and \$5 extra for each additional child. There shall be a \$5 per registrant per day charge for the Summer Camp aftercare. These fees may be further amended from time to time as needed by resolution of the Borough Council. Limited space and enrollment minimums may apply.

Section II

If any part of this Ordinance shall be deemed invalid such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remaining part of this Ordinance. All other Ordinances or parts thereof that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed and superseded.

Section III

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication in accordance with Law.

ORDINANCE #2023/14

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FIXING AND DETERMINING SALARIES OF CERTAIN OFFICERS, POSITIONS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, AND REPEALING ANY AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES HERETOFORE ADOPTED WHICH ARE INCONSISTENT HEREWITH

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Freehold, in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1

Effective January 1, 2022, and through December 31, 2026, the compensation set forth for the fulltime described offices, positions and employees of the Borough of Freehold in the attached Schedule of this Ordinance shall be and are hereby fixed and determined as delineated. All salaries are annual for full-time employees unless otherwise stated. Those employees working less than full-time shall have their pay calculated pro rata based upon hours actually worked.

Section 2

Employees who are members of the collective bargaining units represented by the Police Benevolent Association, Local No. 159 and the Communications Workers of America, Local No. 1032 shall be compensated at the wage rates and ranges as established by their respective Labor Agreements with the Borough. The Collective Bargaining Agreements among the representative labor groups and the Borough shall take precedent over any inconsistency that may exist between the labor unions and the Borough as a result of the enactment of this Ordinance,

Section 3

The employees mentioned in Section 1 and Section 2 of this Ordinance shall also be entitled to all benefits included in the various labor contracts granted by the Mayor and Council to comparable Borough employees.

Section 4

Effective January 1, 2022, and through December 31, 2026, the rate of pay set forth in the attached Schedule for the part-time positions, offices and employees of the Borough of Freehold shall be and are hereby fixed and determined as delineated.

Section 5

If any part of this Ordinance shall be deemed invalid such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remaining part of this Ordinance.

Section 6

Any Ordinance or portions thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed and superseded.

Section 7

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication in accordance with Law.

F. Maintenance and repair of meters. The property owner shall be responsible for all damages to water meters caused by freezing, accidents and/or negligence. The Borough of Freehold will, in its discretion, replace any such damaged meters and the necessary expenses for such repairs, maintenance or replacement shall be borne by the owner and shall be charged against and collected from the owner of the premises. In addition to the repair, maintenance, and replacement costs, there shall be an additional \$50.00 administrative surcharge that shall be charged to the owner.

ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

Box 6669, Freehold, New Jersey, 07728, (hereinafter referred to as "Freehold") and the BOROUGH OF FREEHOLD, NJ whose address is 30 Mechanic Street, Freehold, NJ 07728; ATTN: Steve Gallo, Business Administrator; Phone 732-462-4200 (hereinafter referred to as "Licensee").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Freehold is the owner and operator of a certain racing facility located at 130 Park Ave., Freehold, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Licensee desires to acquire a license and Freehold desires to grant to the Licensee a license to host a fireworks display and family-friendly concert pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, acknowledged by the parties to be satisfactory and adequate, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. SUBJECT OF LICENSE It is agreed that Licensee is hereby granted the right and privilege to host a fireworks display and family-friendly concert in the area of Freehold Raceway commonly referred to as Freehold Raceway track apron (the "Facility"). Freehold retains the exclusive rights to provide all food and beverage for this event.
- 2. TIMING It is agreed that Licensee will begin use of the facility for setup on Saturday, July 1, 2023. Event will be Sunday, July 2, 2023 (rain date to be mutually agreed by the parties). Licensee agrees to vacate the facility before but no later than 5:00pm on Monday, July 3, 2023.
- 3. OBLIGATIONS OF FREEHOLD In addition to any other obligations of Freehold contained herein, Freehold will provide the following for the benefit of the Licensee: a) area commonly known as Freehold Raceway track apron; b) access to facility during normal business hours; c) limited parking; d) electrical power for stage only subject to review of power requirements; e) all trash receptacles/dumpsters and clean up as required for the event.
- 4. OBLIGATIONS OF LICENSEE In addition to any other obligations of Licensee contained herein, Licensee must provide the following: a) all personnel, equipment, staging, etc. as necessary to conduct the event; b) layout the event so that it conforms with local and state code requirements; c) all necessary permits to conduct event; d) all electrical power and hook-ups for the event (except for stage); e) all additional security and traffic control for the event including overnight security if required.
- 5. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS The Licensee shall comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations pertaining to the events conducted by it at the Facility and will

hold Freehold harmless against any fine, penalty or damage from any actual or alleged failure on the part of the Licensee to comply herewith.

- **6. INSURANCE** The Licensee agrees to carry at all times, in connection with hosting a fireworks display and concert at the Facility, the following insurance:
 - General liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$ 1,000,000 per occurrence;
 \$2,000,000 aggregate.
 - 2. Auto liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence,
 - 3. Umbrella policy in the minimum amount of \$4,000,000 per occurrence; \$4,000,000 aggregate. This coverage must apply excess of the General Liability, Employers Liability and Auto Liability coverages.
 - 4. Workers Compensation and Employers Liability insurance for all of the Licensee's employees. Workers Compensation coverage statutory limits; Employers Liability coverage minimum limit of \$500,000 each accident / \$500,000 each employee / \$500,000 policy limit.

The Licensee agrees to provide Freehold with certificates evidencing the issuance of such insurance which:

- names FR Park Racing, LP, its Owners, Shareholders, Partners, Members, and Representatives as additional insured on the General Liability, Auto Liability and <u>Umbrella Liability policies</u>. Coverage is to apply on a Primary and Non-contributory basis.
- 2. provides a <u>waiver of subrogation</u> in favor of **FR Park Racing, LP**, its Owners, Shareholders, Partners, Members, and Representatives <u>on the General Liability, Auto Liability and Umbrella Liability policies.</u>

In addition, the Licensee agrees that fireworks vendor will carry at all times, insurance with the same limits, Primary and Non-contributory Additional Insured coverage and Waiver of Subrogation coverage in favor of the above listed Additional Insureds. The fireworks vendor agrees to provide Freehold with certificates evidencing the issuance of such insurance.

7. INDEMNIFICATION – To the extent that state and/or federal laws limit the terms and conditions of this clause, it shall be deemed so limited to comply with such state and/or federal law. This clause shall survive termination of this contract. Licensee shall indemnify and hold harmless Freehold, and agents and employees (the "Indemnified Parties") of any of them from and against claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including but not limited to attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from occupancy of the licensed property, provided that such claim, damage, loss, or expense is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease, or death, or to injury to or destruction of tangible property but only to the extent caused by the negligent acts or omissions

of the Lessee, anyone directly or indirectly employed by them or anyone for whose acts they may be liable, regardless of whether or not such claim, damage, loss, expense, is caused in part by any Indemnified Party. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or reduce other rights, obligations or indemnity which would otherwise exist as to a party or person described in this Indemnification.

These Indemnification provisions shall survive the termination of this Contract.

Licensee agrees Freehold is not responsible for security at any time during the period of this

License Agreement and Freehold is not responsible in the event of theft, vandalism or damage to

- 10. BREACH OF TERMS In the event either party breaches any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement then the other party shall have the option of canceling this Agreement upon five (5) days written notice to the breaching party.
- 11. FAILURE OF ACCESS OR DESTRUCTION BY FIRE In the event that the Facility is damaged by fire, an Act of God or is rendered incapable of being used due to labor disputes, strikes or some other job action or protest, Freehold shall bear no liability to the Licensee for such failure or incapability.
- 12. DAMAGES Licensee is required to repair any damages to the Facility, if any, at its own expense, or to compensate Freehold additionally for such damage.
- 13. ENTIRE AGREEMENT This Agreement contains the entire understanding among the parties and supersedes any prior understanding and agreement, verbal or written, between them respecting the within subject matter. Any subsequent amendments to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by both parties.
- 14. BINDING EFFECT/VALIDITY This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties. If any provision of this Agreement, or the application of such provision, shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby.

Water Resource Management (WRM) is pleased to offer this proposal for N-1 Licensed Operator services at your Water Treatment Plant.

The following is the scope of services for 2023:

- 1. WRM will provide a N-1 Licensed Operator that will at a minimum perform (2) site visits per month and generate correspondence, as necessary, to provide recommendations and/or guidance related to the safe, efficient, and compliant operation of the facilities.
- 2. WRM will coordinate the regulatory sampling and monitoring with the Borough of Freehold staff.
- 3. WRM will review all laboratory monitoring results and prepare a effluent summary report identifying each compound and permit limit after discharge has occurred.
- 4. WRM will prepare the required NJDEP Discharge Monitoring Reports and act as the responsible official or general user for electronic submission of the reports. All electronic submission shall be in accordance with the guidelines and provisions outlined in the Electronic Data Exchange (EDI).
- 5. WRM will review process measurements such as discharge flow associated with the outfall sampling and permit conditions.
